If you've not got your garlic in yet, and your plot is still too wet then consider starting them off in pots, in a greenhouse or coldframe. Once the shoots are up, plant them out at the first opportunity. I did this a few years ago when I was held back by the weather.

Do check your potatoes as blight can still affect them or they can succumb to hidden slug damage.

Please remember the site can be dangerous when wet, particularly soil areas covered with water so do not wade through water.
