(Plus I can only fit so much into the van!) Most on the list are suitable for allotments as they are on the smallest rootstock i.e. Cherry Gisela 5 or Colt, Pears on Quince and Plums Gages , Damsons, on Pixy. Some of the apples are on M106 which is good for step-overs, cordons or espaliers. The Plums, Gages, Damsons or Peaches on SJA are also good for fans and I will also bring some dwarfing M27/M9 apples, and some non chemical products to stop fruit pests. They can also reserve other stuff from the sundries list as well i.e. stakes guards etc.....

Wendy will share news of OU work on site. New fruit planting by Castle Mill and possible other replacement planting on our Castel Mill boundary. Alex and Jeremy will help us share what to do with flooding Tony and Alison will update us on the shredder Sarah will report on the development of trading,

We hope to see you on the 17th. A good turnout is not only essential for the fair management of the site but reassuring for the committee and always more enjoyable.

REMINDER about cars

Please only bring cars on site when necessary and keep to the 5mph limit. While the land is so wet, please be

sure not to let any vehicles off the main hard core paths. Some of the site paths are still too soft to drive on due to the floods. After the water subsides the land will still be saturated and extremely soft. Vehicles not only damage the grass paths but can easily get completely stuck! You'll see under "trading" that we postponed the delivery lorry this week because of the conditions. We'll definitely take delivery of the new trading materials later in the month - if necessary by barrowing goods in from the car park."
