Competition Celebration
of Awards and Certificates
Took place in the Town
Hall on the Town Hall on
Tuesday September 27.**



Entrants in this year's Allotment Competition enjoyed the presentation to the award winners by the Cllr Linda Smith, the councillor with

responsibility for allotments, at the Town Hall on Tuesday 27 September.

This is the ninth year that Oxford's Allotment Competition has been organised jointly by the Oxford and District Federation of Allotment Associations and the Parks Department of Oxford City Council. The objective of the competition is to celebrate the achievements of Oxford's allotment gardeners. The judges look for plots that grow a wide range of vegetables all year round, together with seasonal soft fruit. The emphasis is strongly on the quality of the crops and the overall productivity of the plot, and not on having immaculately manicured plots, although winners have very few weeds!

There were 56 entrants from 11 different allotment sites across the City. In addition, the judges, Tina Mould and Helen Prower, judged entrants in the Best Kept Allotment Site Competition, which 8 of Oxford's 36 allotment sites entered.

The winners of the Challenge Trophy, the overall award, were Ian and Helen Matten from the Lenthall Road Allotment Association. Second was Deisa Holden from the John Garne Way Allotment Association and third was David Allen from the South Ward Allotment Association. Eleven entrants were highly

and Judy Cook, Natalie Symchych and Alison Scott on Plot 51

Castle Mill Consultation - part 2

Following our first public consultation event in July, the University and its design team have now reviewed all feedback received and have progressed with the design development for the exterior of the Castle Mill site.

We would like to invite you to our second consultation event where you will have the opportunity to review and comment on the developed design proposal that the University is intending to submit in a planning application to Oxford City Council. As before, the sessions will provide an opportunity to meet members of the University and its team of consultants as well as to give your feedback. The public consultation sessions will take place as follows:

Day 1: Friday 14 October 2016 between 4.00pm and 7.00pm

Day 2: Saturday 15 October 2016 between 10.00am and 12.00pm

Venue: St Luke's Chapel, Radcliffe Observatory Quarter (ROQ), Woodstock Road, Oxford, OX2 6GG. Members of the University and its design team will be available to answer any queries you may have. We would welcome further feedback on the developed proposal and hardcopy feedback forms will be available at the consultation sessions. An online feedback form will follow on the University's website together with an electronic version of the display information at www.admin.ox.ac.uk/news.

The University will review all feedback and will take it into account before the revised designs are developed into a planning application.
